HEBREW

¹¹ For I know what plans I have in mind for you,' says Adonai, 'plans for well-being (shalom), not for bad things; <u>so that</u> you can have hope (Tikvah) and a future.



Expected: Hope - Tikvah

Literally a cord, rope, (as an attachment, not just a single thread)

[root word: to look for, wait, expect]

End: Future

The latter part, extreme part, most frequently used for time; also posterity.

¹⁴ So shall the knowledge of wisdom be unto thy soul: when thou hast found it, then there shall be **a reward**, and thy **expectation** shall not be cut off.

¹ Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ: ² By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God. ³ And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience; ⁴ And patience, experience; and experience, hope: ⁵ And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us.

¹ Therefore being justified by faith (since we have been acquitted and declared not guilty, to be considered righteous by God because of our trust), we have peace (Shalom) with God through our Lord Jesus Christ: ² By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God. (Also through him and on the ground of our trust, we the righteous ones have gained access or the gate to approach God's presence to this grace in which we stand; so let us boast about the hope of experiencing God's glory.)



Romans 5:3-5_{KJV}

³ And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience; (not only that, let us also boast in our afflictions or troubles; because we know that trouble produces cheerful or hopeful endurance, steadfastness, constancy)⁴ And patience, experience (proven character, habits, and manner -*in greek: "test"*); and experience, hope (joyful and confident expectation of good),: ⁵ And hope maketh not ashamed (does not let us down or does not in the end lead to our being despaired in disillusionment and shame); because the love of God is shed abroad (poured out) in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us.
