and said unto them,

for of such is the kingdom of God.*





Matthew 18:1-5_{CJB}

¹ At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "So who is greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" ² He called a child and had him stand among them. ³ "Truly I tell you," he said, "unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. ⁴ Therefore, whoever humbles himself like this child—this one is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. ⁵ And whoever welcomes one child like this in my name welcomes me.





Mark 10:15_{kJV}

15 Verily I say unto you,
Whosoever shall not **receive** (accept, take,
embrace, not to reject) the kingdom of God as a
little child,
he shall not enter therein.





Mark 10:16_{KJV}

¹⁶ And he took them up in his arms, put his hands upon them, and blessed them.

Blessed

Greek: to speak well of, speak kindly of someone, to praise, celebrate with praises, cause to prosper, make happy, favored by God.

Hebrew: to cause to prosper, to be abundant
