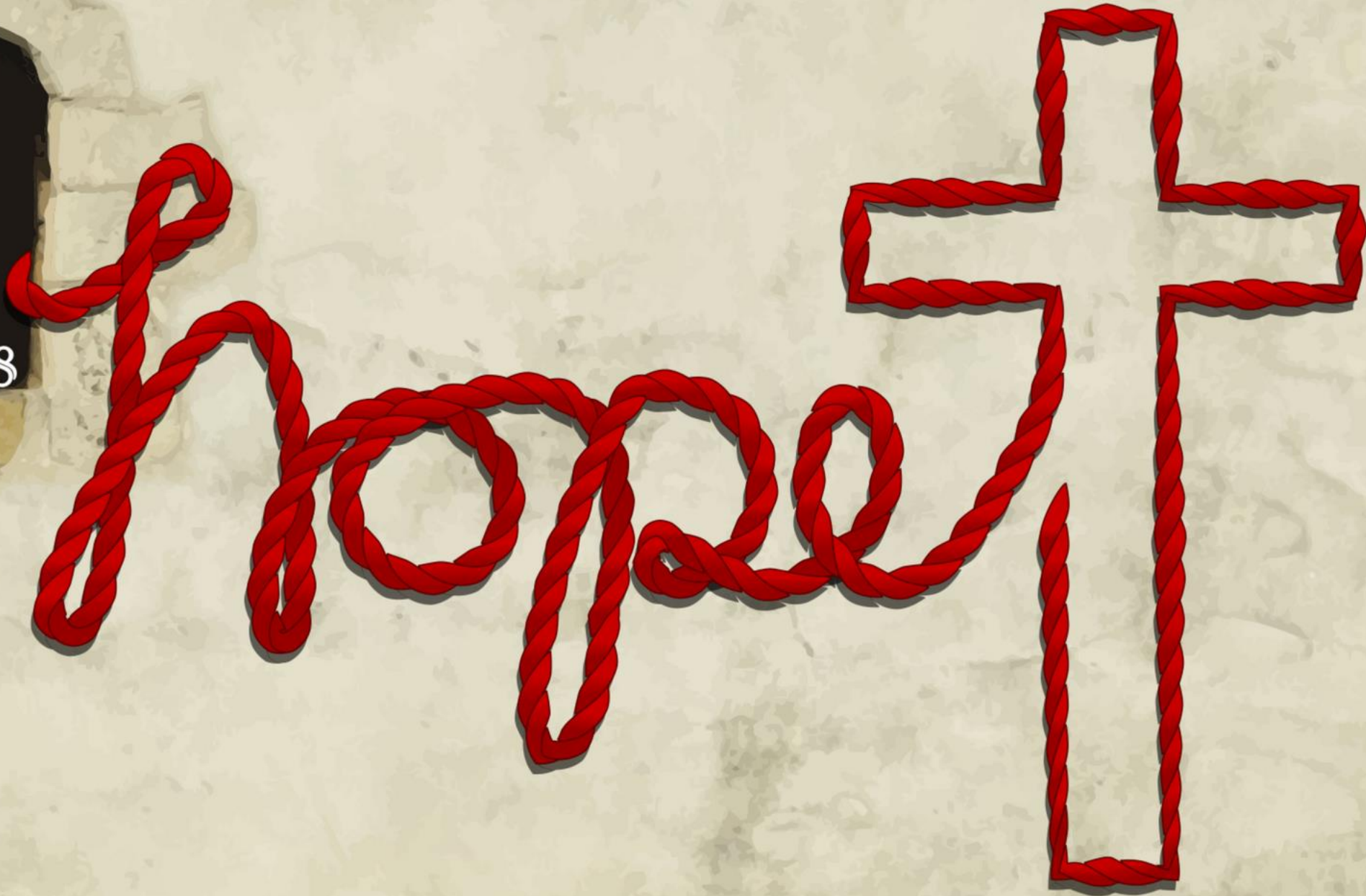

# Mark 10:13-16<sub>KJV</sub>

<sup>13</sup> And they brought young children to him, that he should touch them: and his disciples rebuked those that brought them. <sup>13</sup> But when Jesus saw it, he was much displeased, and said unto them, Suffer the little children to come unto me, and forbid them not: for of such is the kingdom of God. <sup>15</sup> Verily I say unto you, Whosoever shall not receive the kingdom of God as a little child, he shall not enter therein. <sup>16</sup> And he took them up in his arms, put his hands upon them, and blessed them.

# Mark 10:14<sub>KJV</sub>

<sup>14</sup> But when Jesus saw it,

**he was much displeased** (to be greatly afflicted, to be indignant - expressing strong displeasure at something considered unjust, offensive, insulting),

and said unto them,

Suffer the little children to come unto me, and forbid them not:

for of such is the kingdom of God.\*



# Matthew 18:1-5<sub>CJB</sub>

<sup>1</sup> At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, “So who is greatest in the kingdom of heaven?” <sup>2</sup> He called a child and had him stand among them. <sup>3</sup> “Truly I tell you,” he said, “unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. <sup>4</sup> Therefore, whoever humbles himself like this child—this one is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. <sup>5</sup> And whoever welcomes one child like this in my name welcomes me.





# Mark 10:15<sub>KJV</sub>

<sup>15</sup> Verily I say unto you,

Whosoever shall not **receive** (accept, take, embrace, not to reject) the kingdom of God as a little child,

he shall not enter therein.



# Mark 10:16<sub>KJV</sub>

<sup>16</sup> And he took them up in his arms,  
put his hands upon them,  
and blessed them.

*Greek:* to speak well of, speak kindly of someone, to praise, celebrate with praises, cause to prosper, make happy, favored by God.

*Hebrew:* to cause to prosper, to be abundant
