² To speak evil of no man, to be no brawlers, but gentle, shewing all meekness unto all men.





Titus 3:1-2_{kJV}

¹ Put them in mind (remind quietly) to be subject (voluntary attitude of giving in, cooperating and carrying a burden) to principalities (first place leader) and powers (magistrates), to obey magistrates (be persuaded by a ruler), to be ready to every good work (toil, act, deed), ² To speak evil (slander) of no man, to be no brawlers (peaceable), but gentle (appropriate, mild, kind), shewing all meekness (humility, gentleness) unto all men.





Titus 3:3_{kJv}

³ For we ourselves also were sometimes foolish, disobedient, deceived, serving divers lusts and pleasures, living in malice and envy, hateful, and hating one another.





Titus 3:3_{kJV}

³ For we ourselves also were sometimes **foolish** (unintelligent, not understood, unwise), disobedient (unpersuadable, non compliant), deceived (to roam, go astray, led away from truth), serving divers (various) lusts (forbidden longings) and pleasures (sensual delight), living in malice (badness, ill-will) and envy (jealousy), hateful (detestable, hated), and hating one another (especially to persecute, detest).

Titus 3:4-7_{HCSB}

⁴ But when the kindness of God our Savior and His love for mankind appeared,

⁵ He saved us—not by works of righteousness that we had done, but according to His mercy, through the washing of regeneration and renewal by the Holy Spirit.

⁶He poured out this Spirit on us abundantly through Jesus Christ our Savior,

⁷ so that having been justified by His grace, we may become heirs with the hope of eternal life.



Titus 3:8_{HCSB}

⁸ This saying is trustworthy. I want you to insist on these things, so that those who have believed God might be careful (exercise thought, be anxious) to devote (maintain-kjv, to stand before, to preside, be over, rule, to be a protector) themselves to good works. These are good (beautiful, excellent, precious, admirable) and profitable (helpful, serviceable, advantageous) for everyone.





Titus 3:9-11_{HCSB}

- ⁹ But avoid foolish debates, genealogies, quarrels, and disputes about the law, for they are unprofitable and worthless.
- ¹⁰ Reject a divisive person after a first and second warning,
- ¹¹ knowing that such a person is perverted and sins, being self-condemned.





Romans 7:4-6_{HCSB}

⁴ Therefore, my brothers, you also were put to death in relation to the law through the crucified body of the Messiah, so that you may belong to another—to Him who was raised from the dead—that we may bear fruit for God. ⁵ For when we were in the flesh, the sinful passions operated through the law in every part of us and bore fruit for death. ⁶ But now we have been released from the law, since we have died to what held us, so that we may serve in the new way of the Spirit and not in the old letter of the law.
