

# Mysteries Revealed



# John 9:1-3<sub>KJV</sub>

<sup>1</sup> And as **Jesus passed by** (to lead near), he saw a man which was blind from his birth.

<sup>2</sup> And his disciples asked him, saying, Master, who did **sin** (to miss the mark), this man, or his parents, that he was born blind?

<sup>3</sup> Jesus answered, Neither hath this man sinned, nor his parents: but that the **works** (toil) of God **should be made manifest** (render apparent, to make clear or visible or known what has been hidden or unknown, to manifest, whether by words, or deeds, or in any other way) in him.



# John 9:4-6<sub>KJV</sub>

**4 I must work the works of him that *sent* me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work.**

**5 As long as I am in **the world** (kosmos), **I am** (to be, to exist) **the light** (phōs) **of the world** (kosmos).**

**6 When he had thus spoken, he spat on the ground, and made clay of the spittle, and he anointed the eyes of the blind man with the clay,**

**7 And said unto him, Go, wash in the pool of Siloam, (which is by interpretation, **Sent**.) He went his way therefore, and washed, and came seeing.**



## Isaiah 35:4-5<sub>KJV</sub>

<sup>4</sup> **Say to them** that are of a fearful heart, Be strong, fear not: behold, your God **will come** with vengeance, even God with a recompence; he **will come** and save you. <sup>5</sup> Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf shall be unstopped.

## Isaiah 42:6-7<sub>KJV</sub>

<sup>6</sup> I the Lord have called thee in righteousness, and will hold thine hand, and will keep thee, and give thee for a covenant of the people, for a light of the Gentiles; <sup>7</sup> To open the blind eyes, to bring out the prisoners from the prison, and them that sit in darkness out of the prison house.



# Isaiah 29:18<sub>KJV</sub>

<sup>18</sup> And in that day shall the deaf hear the words of the book, and the eyes of the blind shall see **out of obscurity** (dusk, gloom, spiritual unreceptivity, a thing that is unclear or difficult to understand), **and out of darkness** (the dark, figuratively: misery, destruction, death, ignorance, sorrow, wickedness).



## John 9:11 KJV

<sup>11</sup> He answered and said, **A man** that is called Jesus made clay, and anointed mine eyes, and said unto me, Go to the pool of Siloam, and wash: and I went and washed, and I received sight.

## John 9:17 KJV

<sup>17</sup> They say unto the blind man again, What sayest thou of him, that he hath opened thine eyes? He said, He is **a prophet**.

## John 9:38 KJV

<sup>38</sup> And he said, **Lord** (supreme in authority, controller, Master, the owner), I believe. And he worshipped him.



# John 9:39-41<sub>KJV</sub>

<sup>39</sup> And Jesus said, For judgment I am come into this world, that they which see not might see; and that they which see might be made blind.

<sup>40</sup> And some of the Pharisees which were with him heard these words, and said unto him, Are we blind also?

<sup>41</sup> Jesus said unto them, If ye were blind, ye should have no sin: but now ye say, We see; therefore your sin remaineth.



# 1 John 1:5-10<sub>KJV</sub>

<sup>5</sup> This is the message we have heard from Him and announce to you, that God is Light, and in Him there is no darkness at all. <sup>6</sup> If we say that we have fellowship with Him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth; <sup>7</sup> but if we walk in the Light as He Himself is in the Light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin. <sup>8</sup> If we say that we have no sin, we are deceiving ourselves and the truth is not in us. <sup>9</sup> If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. <sup>10</sup> If we say that we have not sinned, we make Him a liar and His word is not in us.
